Engaging with Presence as a spiritual practice invites us to consider two different things:



Finding the Essence of Presence

When exactly did family holiday gatherings become so darned difficult?

I began noticing my discomfort and otherness much more after I moved from Texas to California at the beginning of my young adult life. The freedom I felt in my new home, and the restrictive expectations of my old home, began to chafe. It was the culture of my hometown as much as, or even more than, the individuals who made up my family. They were, mostly, trying hard to grow and change together. Still, I was on the forming edge of finding my authentic self, so going back to a place where "Nancy Palmer Jones" was not yet recognized and affirmed felt like a forced return to the role of that younger "Nancy Jones."

It was hard to show up and be fully *present* in those days.

I also thought the problem lay simply in growing up. Don't all of us outgrow the childhood delight of holiday *presents* and vacation times? And then don't we spend the rest of our adulthood trying to recreate those joys or missing them? I thought my expectations were just too high.

Now I see truth ribboning through all these experiences. I was indeed coming into a different, fuller self that didn't fit so well in my old environment. And I also had idealized childhood memories that made it hard for me to accept the more complicated feelings that we humans have as we stumble and grope for new common ground in a difficult world.

This is why I have so much joy about moving into December with you here at the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Gwinnett! Here we can bring all our complicated feelings and difficult experiences. Here we can show up and be authentic, caring in our own unique and



profound ways for ourselves and for each other. Here we can affirm our ever-emerging identities, our new joys and our old wounds. Here we can laugh and empathize and wonder and argue and grow with discomfort and with ease.

Here we can rediscover the essence of real Presence, awake to this very moment in our difficult and glorious world. And what a gift that is! Happy Holidays, beloveds! A blessed December to us all, and to all the world.





What Are We Reading, or Watching, or Listening to?



Don't Click on Scam Email Links or Social-Media Invitations

In November, many UUCG members and friends received yet another fake email claiming to be from Rev. Nancy. In the past, some folk have received fake social-media friend requests from our minister, too.

Our minister will never use these means of communication to ask you to buy gift cards, to open a link that you are not expecting, or to disclose information. Her requests will always be fully explained, make sense in the context of our community life, and—although they may have the occasional typo—they will be basically grammatically correct. You know the sound of our minister's voice; make sure the communication sounds like Rev. Nancy.

If you receive one of these emails or social-media fakes, please take these actions:

- Do double-check the email address from which the message comes by hovering over the sender's name. Is it the email that Rev. Nancy uses for all UUCG work?
- Do not click on or respond to these emails or social-media requests.
- Do alert admin [at] uucg [dot] org that you have received one of these scams. It's good to track how often they occur.
- Do delete the email and do report the social-media invitation once you are sure it is a fake.
- If you have any doubts about an email that might be legitimate, please do send Rev. Nancy a separate note asking if it is authentic.

Such scamming, initiated by bots or hackers, is part of the price of being in a relatively public position. Please do be cautious, and let's stay as safe as we can!

From the Board

Congregational Vote – December 15th Dan Kelly, Board President

The UUCG Board of Trustees will be hosting the annual <u>Winter Congregational Business</u>

<u>Meeting on December 15th at 12:30 pm to vote on the Operating Budget and other Proposals for Congregational Approval.</u> The Board will host a Congregational Conversation on December 1st at 12:30 pm to review the Budget and the Proposals in detail. Please join us for both of these important meetings!

The proposed **2025 Annual Operating Budget** will be available for review by the full Congregation on December 1st, including printed copies to take home and review. It will include a year-to-date assessment of our 2024 Operating Budget to Actuals, and will demonstrate some of the options available to the Congregation.

Importantly, the 2025 Annual Budget will be closely tied to Resolution #2, as outlined below, and the Board will present versions of the Budget that reflect the passing or the declining of Resolution #2.

The Board will present the following Resolutions for Congregational Approval:

Resolution #1:

We, the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Gwinnett, hereby confer the honorary title of Minister Emerita to Reverend Jan Taddeo, in recognition of twelve years of faithful and devoted service to our congregation and community, from 2011 to 2023. The Congregation recognizes the spiritual growth that Reverend Taddeo fostered through guiding us in becoming a certified LGBTQ+ Welcoming Congregation and Green Sanctuary, nurturing the development of a Healthy Congregation Team, supporting active Faith in Action programs, and partnering to create our

Shared Ministry Council leadership model. As a truly Curious, Courageous, and Compassionate individual, Reverend Jan Taddeo exemplifies the core values of UUCG.

Resolution #2:

We, the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Gwinnett, authorize the Board of Trustees to accept the Easement Agreement proposed by SBA, monetizing \$200,000 for approximately half of the lease's current value. Funds are restricted to usage for non-operational costs, and specifically allotted as:

- Payment for Roof Repair (appx. \$65,650)
- Endowment Loan Pay Off (\$15,696.29)
- Mortgage Loan Pay Off (\$52,437.58)
- Capital Expense Reserve Fund (remaining balance, appx. \$66,216.13)

The balance of the Lease remains in effect, continuing to generate a monthly income.

The Board looks forward to discussing these Resolutions and the 2025 Operating Budget with you in a positive and transparent manner that emphasizes our shared values as a Congregation.

This may seem like a scary time. It may be a scary time. But, just saying – right now, in this moment, the fear is engendered by those who want to make us afraid. I choose not to be afraid. I choose to plan and act. I choose to live out my faith. This means living out Justice, Interconnection, Generosity, Love, Pluralism, Equity, and Transformation in MY life.

My actions are tied to politics. Politics means, for me, the rights of citizens. I am going to stand up for my rights and others' rights, who don't have my privileges, AS LONG AS I HAVE BREATH.

After you have rested, please do not rest in fear, please start preparing to speak up and speak out. One way that you have is to prepare to connect with GA state legislators. 


