Unitarian Universalist congregations affirm and promote seven Principles, which we hold as strong values and moral guides.	We live out our Principles within a "living tradition" of wisdom and spirituality, drawn from sources as diverse as science, poetry, scripture, and personal experience. These
1st Principle: The inherent worth and dignity of every person;2nd Principle: Justice, equity and compassion in human relations;	are the six sources our congregations affirm and promote: Direct experience of that transcending mystery and won- der, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life;
3rd Principle: Acceptance of one another and encourage- ment to spiritual growth in our congregations;	Words and deeds of prophetic people which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice,
